ACQUIN-NCPA Cooperation

- ACQUIN and NCPA are both members of **CEENQA**
- ACQUIN and NCPA signed a cooperation agreement in 2012 to
 - enhance quality in higher education,
 - promote the culture of quality,
 - exchange expertise,
 - provide staff development opportunities,
 - conduct nominations of experts,
 - collaborate in research on quality assurance.

ACQUIN-NCPA Cooperation

- The cooperation is a
 - substantial contribution to internationalisation as a process of "integrating an international, intercultural, or global dimension in the purpose, functions, or delivery of postsecondary education" (Knight, 2003).
 - vital link between German and Russian higher education systems and the societies in both countries.
 - basis for mutual understanding and learning in regard to quality assurance, e.g. in joint accreditation procedures.

Intercultural misunderstandings



Caution when using own values as a reference point!

Joint accreditation – the general procedural framework

- Same professional and quality standards for both agencies
- Assessment criteria (ESG, Guidelines of Good Practice in QA, national regulations)
- Composition of multi-national review teams: minimum 5 peer reviewers (student representative, representative of the labour market, scientific peers)

Case: NCPA-ACQUIN Programme Accreditation

- Joint external review of the clusters of the educational programmes
 - "Construction"
 - "Management"
 - "Metallurgy"

held on October 20-22, 2015 in Peter the Great St. Petersburg Polytechnic University (Russia)

- Reviewers from Russia and Germany
- Language: English, Russian and German

Case: NCPA-ACQUIN Programme Accreditation



Some empirical insights from the cooperation

Accreditation agencies have to consider:

- different terminologies and concepts,
- different social and political contexts,
- different perspectives on quality

when carrying out joint accreditation procedures.

Mutual understanding for social and political contexts

Social context

- Social values, standards and culture (e.g. postmaterialism)
- Status and prestige of higher education

Political context

- Influence of governments on standards in higher education, especially national regulation
- Financing of higher education systems

Mutual understanding for perspectives on quality

Quality as...

- value for money
- consistency
- excellence
- fitness of/for purpose

→ Quality cultures might clash!

Future perspectives for ACQUIN and NCPA

Co-operation should focus on

- ✓ Staff development and staff exchange
- Joint accreditations with harmonised procedures
- Impact assessment of programme accreditations
